#### A. Items Opening Meeting

- 1. Call to Order Mayor Justin Hamilton called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.
- 2. Pledge Mayor Justin Hamilton led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3. Roll Call Village Secretary called roll: Present were: Mayor Justin Hamilton, Mayor ProTem Scott Staeb, Councilmember Tex Tubbs, Councilmember Jeff Schroeder, and Councilmember John Schwarz. Absent Councilmember Mark Maund. A quorum was present.

#### **B.** Consent Agenda

- 1. Approval of Minutes June 19, 2024 Regular Meeting of the Village Council
- 2. Approval of Minutes June 26, 2024 Village Council Budget Workshop.
- 3. Approve and authorize Mayor Justin Hamilton to sign TML Member ILA to continue coverage for existing Cyber Coverage to be effective midnight on September 30, 2024. Councilmember Tex Tubbs asked for discussion to clarify Cyber Coverage. The Village has had Cyber Coverage with TML, the required acceptance of ILA to continue Cyber Coverage is due to change in TML funding program for Cyber Coverage. The Village may opt-in, cancel, or find another carrier.

Councilmember Tex Tubbs made a motion to approve minutes of the June 19, 2024, and June 26, 2024, Council meetings as presented and to approve ILA to continue Cyber Coverage with TML authorizing Mayor Hamilton to sign acceptance. Mayor ProTem Scott Staeb seconded the motion. Councilmembers John Schwarz and Jeff Schroeder in agreement to approve minutes of the June 19, 2024, and June 26, 2024, Council meetings as presented and to approve ILA to continue Cyber Coverage with TML authorizing Mayor Hamilton to sign acceptance. Motion carries.

#### C. Public Comments

No public comments received.

#### D. Mayor Report

Mayor Hamilton introduced Village attorney, Caroline Kelley, joining the Council for the meeting. Mayor Hamilton introduced Village Animal Control Officer, Tony Reynolds.

#### E. Travis County Sheriff's Report

Deputy Nick McCaughey had no situations of concern to report. Councilmember Tex Tubbs requested monthly summary report of calls received for Point Venture through Travis County Sheriff's Office.

#### **Emergency Services Report**

Chris Colunga, Fire Marshal Travis County ESD 1, reported there were five calls for Point Venture through Travis County ESD in June. Mayor Hamilton asked Fire Marshall Colunga to give report on update to Firewise property site compliance. Fire Marshall reported this endeavor began July 2023 with 115 properties. As of July 17 there is one remaining property that has received notifications and not brought lot into compliance.

#### F. Items to Consider

1. Review, discussion and possible action on Resolution No. 2024-07-17 designating certain meetings as Regular Village Council Meetings.

Councilmember Jeff Schroeder expressed he was in agreement to designate the 12 annual Council Meetings scheduled each month by Council approval beginning of each year but not additional meetings called by the Mayor for budget workshops. Mayor ProTem Scott Staeb discussed he was also not in agreement to add meetings called by the Mayor for budget workshops. Mayor Hamilton discussed he felt addition of meetings called by the Mayor could be unfairly directed toward a councilmember.

Mayor ProTem Scott Staeb made a motion to adopt Resolution 2024-07-17 designating the third Wednesday of each month as regular scheduled Village Council meetings and striking 2. b. all meetings called by the Mayor for consideration and adoption of the budget and/or tax rate. Councilmember John Schwarz seconded the motion. Councilmember Jeff Schroeder in agreement with motion to adopt resolution to designate the third Wednesday of each month as regular scheduled Council meeting. Councilmember Tex Tubbs oppose motion. Motion carries.

2. Discussion and possible action regarding utilization and duties of the Planning and Zoning Commission and Commission member appointment/re-appointment.

Mayor Justin Hamilton expressed appreciation to the members of the Planning and Zoning Commission for their time and efforts. Mayor Hamilton would like Council to address either Planning and Zoning member appointments/re-appointments or determine to dissolve the P&Z Commission. Steve Tabaska, chair of the P&Z Commission, was invited to give report for the P&Z activities at this time.

Councilmember Tex Tubbs made a motion to re-appoint Eric Carlson and Doug Jaworski for two year term to the P&Z Commission. No second to this motion was received. Motion does not carry.

Councilmember Jeff Schroeder made a motion to dissolve the P&Z Commission at this time. Councilmember John Schwarz seconded the motion. Mayor ProTem Scott Staeb in agreement with motion to dissolve P&Z Commission. Tex Tubbs oppose motion to dissolve P&Z Commission. Motion to dissolve P&Z Commission carries.

3. Discuss possible amendment to building permitting ordinances (Chapter 4 Code of Ordinances) and to related planning and development permit fees (Article A3 of Appendix A Code of Ordinances).

Council general discussion of Village Code Appendix of Fees most specifically New Construction Residential and Additions and Remodels Residential building fees. Update to fees, additional fees to be applied, addition of consultant cost fee, adopt escrow for building project permitting fees were discussed.

Councilmember Tex Tubbs made a motion to table this discussion to the August regular Council meeting and direct staff to provide approximate amount of time for Village staff building plan review and permit process and approximate time and expense for ATS review of building plan to Village building and zoning code requirements. Mayor ProTem Scott Staeb seconded the motion. Councilmembers John Schwarz and Jeff Schroeder in agreement to table discussion to August meeting and receive further information for review. Motion to table carries.

4. Discuss logistics of duties of Building Official and Assistant Building Official.

Proactive building sites weekly inspections, notice of building site violations and noise control, issuance of permits and certificates of occupancy, application of stop work order discussed. 

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 2024-\_\_-**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF POINT VENTURE, TEXAS, AMENDING APPENDIX A OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF POINT VENTURE, TEXAS; AMENDING THE VILLAGE OF POINT VENTURE FEE SCHEDULE; PROVIDING FINDINGS OF FACT; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Village Council of the Village of Point Venture ("Village Council") seeks to provide for the public health, safety and welfare of its citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 51.001 of the Texas Local Government Code, the Village of Point Venture may adopt and amend ordinances for the good government, peace and order of the Village, as necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Point Venture has previously adopted certain planning and development permit fees; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Council of the Village of Point Venture desires to revise such fees to ensure the cost to the Village for providing the service associated with the fees bear a reasonable relationship to the established fees; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council of the Village of Point Venture finds that the fees, as amended, bear a reasonable relation to the cost involved in the review and consideration of the permitted activities; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council of the Village of Point Venture finds the fees serve the municipal purposes of orderly subdivision development and building construction; and

WHEREAS, adoption of this ordinance will promote the orderly and safe use of property within the Village; and

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF POINT VENTURE, TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS THAT:

**SECTION 1. Findings of Fact.** All of the above recitals and premises are hereby found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the Village Council of the Village of Point Venture, are made a part hereof for all purposes and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if restated in their entirety.

**SECTION 2. Amendments.** Appendix A of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Point Venture, Texas is hereby amended by deleting sections A3.002, A3.003, A3.004 and A3.005 thereof and substituting therefor new sections A3.002, A3.003, A3.004, A3.005, as provided on Exhibit A, attached hereto.

**SECTION 3. Amendments.** Appendix A of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Point Venture, Texas is hereby additionally amended by adding new section A3.006 as also provided on Exhibit A attached hereto.

**SECTION 4. Repeal.** This Ordinance shall be and is hereby cumulative of all other ordinances of the Village of Point Venture, Texas, and this Ordinance shall not operate to repeal or affect any of such other ordinances except insofar as the provisions thereof might be inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, in which event such conflicting provisions, if any, in such other ordinances are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 5. Severability.** Should any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it is expressly provided that any and all remaining portions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. The Village Council of the Village of Point Venture hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

**SECTION 6. Codification.** The Village Secretary is further directed to have this Ordinance codified at the next available codification update.

**SECTION 7. Effective Date.** That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of passage, in accordance with law, and it is so ordained.
